




## Faculty Review of Open eTextbooks



- Very superficial and generic coverage of the subject matter.
- Research sources are not discussed in the depth expected of a college textbook.
- Extremely little discussion of visual and graphic design and using slides effectively.
- Lack of discussion of cross-cultural or international communication.
- Inadequate acknowledgement of the importance of technology or computer-mediated communication.
- The discourse of the textbook seems disconnected from current issues about the ethics of public speaking, particularly controversies about inclusive language.
- Lack of coverage of student research methods for speeches with informative components makes it not usable in academic contexts.
